## Department of Computer Science and Engineering Regulations of Five-Year Undergraduate-Master's Degree Program

Approved and issued by the Department General Meeting on December 30, 1999. Amended and approved by the Department General Meeting on February 19, 2009. - I. This set of regulations is specifically issued in accordance with "Regulations of Five-Year Undergraduate-Master's (BS-MS) Degree Program" of National Sun Yat-sen University (NSYSU) in order to encourage NSYSU's excellent undergraduate students of bachelor programs to continue master's degree programs in the university, and to achieve continuous learning as well as shorten study periods.
- II. An undergraduate student of a university department who has completed five semesters of studies and has study performances ranked in the top 50% of his/her department, or is recommended by a faculty member of the department, may submit an application to the department.
- III. An applicant shall submit personal resume, transcripts of all school years, and certificates of ranks in the previous five semesters as well as other supportive information.
- IV. Places and acceptance students to be enrolled each school year shall be reviewed by the admission committee of the department to determine.
- V. The enrolled students are qualified as both BS degree candidates and preparatory graduate student of master's program.
- VI. Once qualified as a preparatory graduate student, the student shall complete his/her BS degree and participate in master's program recommendation screening of the department or entrance examination before or during the eighth semester. The student is officially qualified as a master's degree student after passing the screening or entrance examination.
- VII. The graduate courses that are taken as elective courses during undergraduate studies may be used to apply for minimum master's credits waiver. Graduate course credits that have been included in bachelor graduation credits shall not be used to apply for credits waiver and transference for the master's program.
- VIII. The present regulations shall be implemented following approvals of department general meetings and academic affairs meetings as well as authorization of the president. The same procedure shall be carried out when amendments are to be made.
